TULAMEEN RIVER BROWN BRIDGE



The Town of Princeton will be redecking the Tulameen River Brown Bridge starting on the **2**nd **of October**. The Bridge over the Tulameen River will be closed from **October 2**nd **to October 20**th and traffic will be re-routed via Old Hedley Road and Highway 5A.

THE PEDESTRIAN SIDEWALK WILL REMAIN OPEN!

The work will include:

- Upgrading/replacement of the guard rails along the sidewalk and guard rails and bull rails along the bridge deck.
- Replacement of all the bridge decking using a new technology Helix screws to fasten the boards.

The Town of Princeton has ordered the decking material locally and the Public Works Crew will be doing the work.

NO FIREWORKS OR FIRECRACKERS



HUMAN-WILDLIFE CONFLICTS

It is your responsibility to report any human-wildlife conflict to the Conservation Officer Service. Posting on social media is not an effective way to report a human-wildlife encounters.

If it is an EMERGENCY call RCMP – dial 911 or local Princeton Dispatch at 1-250-295-6911. REPORTING DECEASED WILDLIFE:

- If the deceased wildlife is found on private property it is the property owner's responsibility to remove it.
- If found within town limits: 1-250-295-3135.
- If found on highway: Argo Road Maintenance at 1-800-663-7623.

TIPS:

- Never feed or approach wildlife. If a wild animal approaches you, back away and give it space.
- Keep your garbage in until collection day.
- Pick fruit as it ripens no windfalls.
- Birdfeeders should come down during "bear season."
