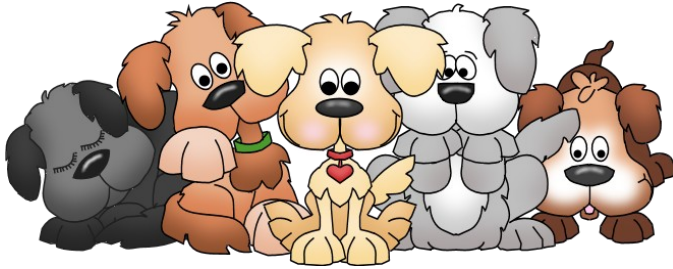

PROPOSED DOG PARK



The Town of Princeton would like to announce the proposed location of a new dog park. The location is off the KVR trail just west of the Caboose. The public will be able to park at the Caboose parking area (beside Subway) and walk the KVR Trail to the new park.

A dog park has been discussed by Council and one of the main concerns was location. The location needed to be accessible and include sufficient parking. The proposed Dog Park is in a great location, close to the KVR Trail, accessible to everyone and includes plenty of parking.

103 VERMILION AVENUE—THE BUGNUT BUILDING

After reviewing previously submitted assessments from staff and independent contractors regarding the very poor physical state of the Town building located at 103 Vermilion Avenue (the Bugnut building) Princeton Town Council has decided that the existing building must be removed. This decision was made considering that the cost estimates to repair the known structural deficiencies would exceed the cost of constructing a new building.

Mayor Armitage and Council view this as an “opportunity” for the Town of Princeton to re-use this focal area located within the Town Centre and invite suggestions from the public as to what the property may be used for in the future.
