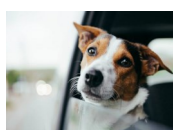

## WATER RESTRICTIONS



Princeton is in Stage One Watering Restrictions unless otherwise notified. Most lawns only need about 2.5 cm (one inch) of water per week—about the depth of a tuna can. Water your lawn or garden—NOT PAVEMENT! Leave grass 5-8cm (2-3 inches) long. Water stays longer when grass is longer. Leave grass clippings as mulch. This helps feed the lawn and retain moisture. To prevent evaporation, don't water in the heat of the day.

### Speaking of 'Heat of the Day'...



Dog lovers know the basics of keeping dogs safe in the summer months: Bring lots of water with you on walks, watch for the signs of your dog over heating and do not leave dogs in your vehicle on hot days. Temperatures in a vehicle can more than double what they are outside within minutes. If possible stay off pavement and other hot surfaces as they can burn your dog's feet. Take advantage of the Town of Princeton Off Leash Dog Park located on Burton Ave just off the KVR (west of Subway).

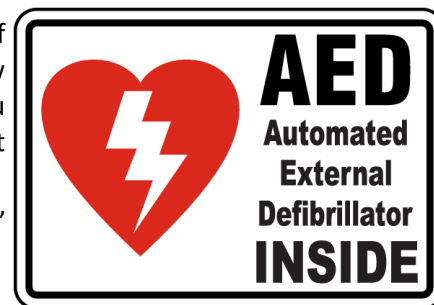




## AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR

## DEVELOPMENT OF 103 VERMILION AVENUE

Council is proposing a development of 103 Vermilion that will compliment the area, be attractive and welcoming, and is supportive of Council’s vision and OCP. A focus will be placed on honoring the Princeton Veterans and to incorporate nature into the space.

As per Council’s directives, staff has engaged the services of Meiklejohn Architectural Design Studio out of Penticton to develop a site plan. The architect was given the following criteria:

- The new development must respect and enhance Veterans’ Square
- It must encourage social gathering of our citizens
- It should incorporate a fire feature to create warmth and atmosphere
- It should reflect the existing architecture and greenery
- It should provide for storage of tables and chairs
- It should have an open area for reflection and celebration
- It should have a BBQ/outdoor kitchen area to support community events

The renderings and site plan are now complete and are posted on the Town’s web site. Citizens are encouraged to view the proposed plan and provide comments or feedback by emailing [admin@princeton.ca](mailto:admin@princeton.ca) or comments can be dropped off at Town Hall, 151 Vermilion Avenue before June 11<sup>th</sup>, 2018.
